## BRASSERIE CANTILLON

Anderlecht, Brussels

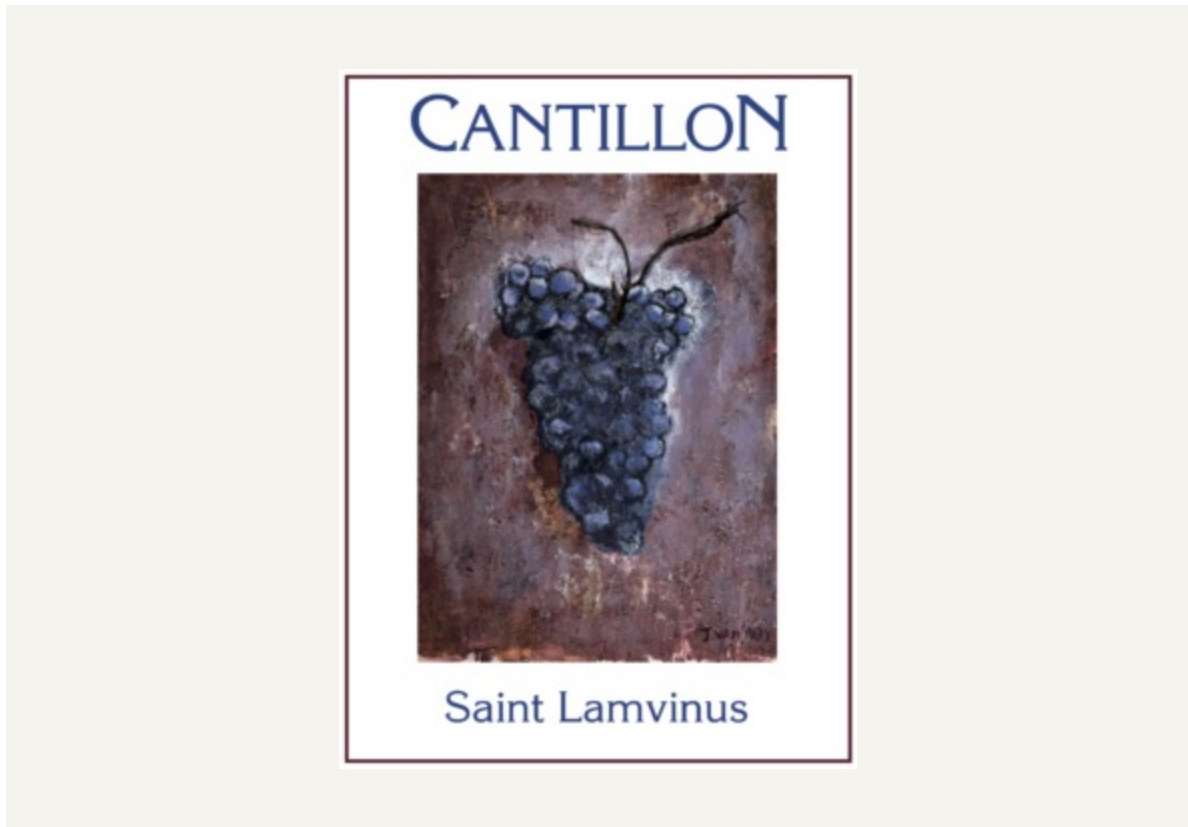
Undoubtedly one of the world's greatest breweries, Brasserie Cantillon was founded in Brussels in 1900 and has been considered one of the finest producers of traditional lambic ever since.

Today, fourth generation brewer Jean Van Roy is at the helm and the brewery has never been in safer hands. While working with the utmost respect for tradition, Jean has refused to stand still, converting the brewery to organics and continuing to release a dizzying number of new cuvées, which include fascinating collaborations with some of Europe's great vigneron.

In essence, the beers are made the same way they always have been here. Wild fermented in open top vats and aged in old wooden casks, lambics of different ages are often blended and sometimes infused with berries, stone fruit, grapes, marc or hops, producing pure, vibrant beers of kaleidoscopic complexity.

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### SAINT LAMVINUS

This was the brewery's first collaboration with vignerons and remains one of their most iconic beers. It sees a blend of lambics around eighteen months old infused for two months with Merlot grapes from Bordeaux, which lend colour, depth and tannin. Remarkably vinous, it offers layers of sour red fruits, earth and funk, making for a drink unlike any other.
